### Ammu Swaminathan

(1894 - 1978)

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from the Madras Constituency. In the assembly, Ammu participated in the debates on fundamental rights and directive principles. She was a strong advocate for women's rights and called for reform of laws and bills related to succession, inheritance and marriage.

### Annie Mascarene

(1902 - 1963)

She represented the Princely State of Travancore and Cochin Union. In the assembly, Annie spoke on the issue of federalism. She was the first woman from Kerala to be elected to the Lok Sabha, where she raised concerns about the underrepresentation of women in politics.

Begum represented the United Provinces. In the Assembly, she
intervened in the debates on national language, India remaining
a part of the Commonwealth, reservation, property rights, and
minority rights.

## Dakshayani Velayudhan (1912 - 1978)

She was the only Dalit woman to be elected to the Constituent Assembly. Dakshayani was inspired to enter politics by her family members' active involvement in civil disobedience movements against upper-caste diktats. She held strong views on the type of federalism that India should adopt.



### Hansa Jivraj Mehta

(1897 - 1995)

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from Bombay. In the assembly, Hansa Mehta strongly argued in favour of women's rights and intervened in debates on uniform civil code and reservation. She also served as the first Vice-Chancellor of the Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda.

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from Bengal. However, Roy resigned in protest against the partition of India. An ardent champion of refugees' rights, she continued contributing to many causes after her resignation from the assembly and helped the victims of the partition.

# Purnina Banerji (1911 - 1951)

She was appointed to the Constituent Assembly from the United Provinces. Banerji intervened in discussions around the Preamble, preventive detention and qualifications for Rajya Sabha. She also led the chorus in singing Jana Gana Mana after its official adoption as the national anthem.



# Pajkumari Amrit Raur (1889 - 1964)

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from the Central Provinces and Berar Province. As a prominent member of the assembly's sub-committees on Fundamental Rights and Minorities, she was instrumental in shaping many constitutional provisions. Kaur became the first woman to hold a cabinet position in the post-independent India.

# **Leruka Lay** (1903 - 1997)

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from West Bengal. Ray made several interventions in the Assembly, including on women's rights issues, minorities' rights and bicameral legislature provisions. She extensively worked on the prevention of women trafficking and the improvement of conditions for women labourers.

Sarojini Naidu (1879 - 1949)

She was appointed to the Constituent Assembly from Bihar. Naidu spoke about the importance of adopting a national flag in the assembly. She was the first Indian woman to be president of the Indian National Congress and to be appointed an Indian state governor.

#### Sucheta Kripalani (1908 - 1974)

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from the United Provinces. Kripalani was a member of the Flag Presentation Committee, which presented the first Indian Flag before the assembly. She was the first woman to be the Chief Minister of an Indian state.

### Vijaya Lakshni Pandit (1900-1990)

She was elected to the Constituent Assembly from the United Provinces. In 1953, Pandit became the first woman to be elected as the President of the United Nations General Assembly. She was also the first Indian woman to hold a cabinet position in pre-independent India.
